# Lower Russian River Town Hall Notes Affordable Housing

#### Challenges:

- Fees are too high to develop second "granny" units.
- · Lack of sites to build more housing.
- · Over-the-top flood insurance.
- 2nd homes/VRBO/crowding out renters and families with moderate incomes.
- Lack of jobs, skills, and diverse economy.
- No monoculture.
- Banks benefit from high values but locals don't. We need more commercial rental space.
- Cost of well and septic systems.
- House flipping.

- · County-managed camps.
- Affordable housing units mandated in every apartment complex with initiatives, referendums, and recalls until this is accomplished.
- Excellent idea to increase bed tax to provide beds for women and children first because they are our present and our future.
- · Revisit land use planning-sewer in Monte Rio.
- Revise laws on newer compost toilets.
- · Live/work until housing for service worker housing.
- · Create a surtax on drug cartel style villas of the winery owners' elites.
- · Limit amount of Air B&B in communities.
- Rent Control.
- Capturing land in land trusts & helping people with low cost loans own their own homes.
- SMART density infill housing with connection to public transportation.
- Living wages.
- Legalize tiny homes on wheels.

# Lower Russian River Town Hall Notes Coast: Protection & Access

### Challenges:

- Protect the coast from developers.
- Continue free access.
- Vacation rentals.
- · Funds to keep parks open and in good condition.
- · Housing and rent control.
- Permit amnesty.
- · Uneducated tourists littering and producing graffiti.

- Percent of lottery ticket sales to parks and environmental education, as in Colorado.
- Tax marijuana.
- Abolish rent control and give people shared mortgages as a way to prevent blight and homelessness & a respect for the environment to future generations to love the world.
- Park service flying drones over our beaches is not the answer. Education of children and tourists at beach seminars and events creates awareness.

## Lower Russian River Town Hall Notes Homelessness

#### Challenges:

- Stop the use of bottled water.
- Something for children at risk other than CPS.
- · Encampments, environmental, community impact, violence by/on campers.
- Illegal camps pose extreme fire hazard & pollute the river and environment.
- · Air B&B taking over the area.
- · Low flow on the Russian River.
- Recycle local, recycle here.
- Marijuana taxes result in the same disaster as gambling and cigarette taxes for schools and children.
- Initiative calling for shelters should not be a nightmare. The public can see homelessness; it cannot be solved by degradation alone.
- · Contamination of river with excrement.

- Have a fund available to assist homeless people due to unforeseen financial hardship.
- Create spaces for homeless encampments like Camp Michela where people can create their own environment free from police intimidation and threats of removal.
- Managed camps, Housing First—some campers do not strive to be housed so they need options for that too.
- Tax winery events, wine and grape sales, and excessive water usage by these wealthy investors.
- Fund volunteer groups doing education and outreach so that they can do even more.
- Tiny home villages, backyards, and driveways, second units for homeowners as additional income.
- Some form of community service during dedicated hours should be a requirement for living in a tent city, small house, etc. Free help just enables.

# Lower Russian River Town Hall Notes Russian River: Environmental Health

#### Challenges:

- Air quality: improper, unclean burning, no "spare the air", oversight on open residential burning.
- Failing septic systems within waterways leading into creeks and rivers.
- · Low-flow: blue-green toxic algae, negative impacts on tourism and the economy.
- River access is insufficient: buy land and convert to parks.
- Investigate Bohemian Grove in preparation for thermal nuclear war (fallout shelters) and the potential use of the hole in the head in Jenner as a potential fresh water source.
- "Autocamp" is allowed: 35 open burn pits in Guernewood canyon, sometime insanity.
- · Homeless camp results in trash on the river bank and is a fire hazard.
- Don't pressure to develop on the Sonoma coast.
- Invasive species.
- · Storm drains to river results in trash.
- Wildlife protection.

- Enforce air quality regulations, prohibit open residential burning and unclean burning, and make river areas as clean as BAAQMD.
- Grants to property owners to fix septic systems.
- Connect as many homes as possible to the sewer system.
- Ban gas motor boats on the river. Only allow canoes, electric motors, and kayaks.
- Build a recreation area center complete with a swimming pool and basketball courts.
- Congressional investigation on the relationship between "Grove Members" and professional lobbyists.
- Gas powered watercraft banned on Lake Sonoma to improve drinking water quality.
- Ban GMOs.
- Revive Occidental Community Center gym.
- County-managed camps.

# Lower Russian River Town Hall Notes Tourism Impacts: Wineries, VRBOs

#### Challenges:

- Traffic.
- · County retirement packages.
- Protect Sonoma coast from development.
- · No reasonably priced rentals.
- Lack of green infrastructure, complete streets, and bike and pedestrian multivse pathways.
- Poor roads.
- · Better code of enforcement of VRs, specifically non-permitted VRs.
- · No affordable rentals for lower income/working families.
- Lack of parking at our own homes from nonresident people.

- Consistent and reasonable speed limit.
- Make "public service" less rewarding.
- · Balanced options, something for everyone; money incentive to maintain options.
- · Better connection with SMART to Fulton Road.
- Improve sections of roads instead of a few entire roads.
- Event permits should address traffic mitigation (officers at night, parking, etc.).
- Transit occupancy tax and TOT should be dedicated specifically to roads, housing, etc.
- Tax write-off incentives to homeowners participating in lowered rental rates.
