# Santa Rosa Town Hall Notes Affordable Housing

## Challenges:

- · Low-cost housing.
- · Cost of housing does not follow family income.
- · Unreasonably high rents.
- · "Reasonable" rent should be a major concern.
- Not sure that this should be a priority for the county; maybe cities should take the lead.
- · More areas for low-income apartments because those rental rates are lower.
- · Where are we going to build the new housing?

- By right process.
- · Expand supply for land.
- · More rent control.
- · Streamline permitting for small (or even "tiny") homes,
- · Control rather than increase costs.
- · Increase supply of housing, including apartments.
- · Simplify/expedite permit process for housing development.

# Santa Rosa Town Hall Notes Homelessness

## Challenges:

- · Homes for everyone.
- · There are a lot of homeless in downtown Santa Rosa.
- · Training to make them more productive citizens.
- More mental health services needed.
- · The homeless population around Roseland has increased.
- · Housing issues.
- Where can the homeless who have animals sleep? Some sleep at "A Place to Play" park by the pond and restrooms.
- Homelessness is definitely a growing problem.

- · Help them find work.
- · Give them support in finding a home that is safe.
- · Spread out facilities for the homeless.
- Fire Jenilynn Holmes, send meth dealers to prison, no free accommodations for young people who have family they could live with.
- Provide them with an open space to camp in. Let them manage it under supervision. Teach gardening there. Create a labor pickup location there for those needing assistance. Run a background check to ensure civil participation. Those who have background issues should be directed to suitable support systems.

# Santa Rosa Town Hall Notes River Access/Coast Protection, Access

### Challenges:

- What is your position on completing pedestrian and bike trails around Bodega Bay?
- Algae blooms in rivers, high water temperatures, pollution from septic tanks. We
  need to clean up the sources of pollution and save the salmon runs.
- Runoff from dairies and manure making its way to river via Laguna.
- Trash pollution.
- Leave the coast as it is if there is no money to protect it.

- · Publically report river health and monthly testing on county web site.
- · Organic agriculture, riparian protection, and sewage treatment plants.
- Sediment control through proper setbacks, appropriate riparian visitation and recharge of groundwater basin (groundwater is directly connected to surface flow).
- Discourage littering.
- · Oppose low flow in our river.
- Ban GMOs in Sonoma County.

# Santa Rosa Town Hall Notes Roads

### Challenges:

- Roads need maintenance but the Bodean asphalt plants need to be moved to a remote location with heavy industrial zoning so that it does not cause detrimental impacts to densely populated neighborhoods.
- Roads are appalling; potholes cause vehicle damage and accidents.
- · Uneven pavement and roads/streets hostile for pedestrians.
- · Money to fix roads.
- In addition to cars and potholes, we also need to think about pedestrians and cyclists.

- Improve bus transit routes between West County and Santa Rosa.
- Try to fix the pavement.
- · Use prisoners to help restore roads.
- · Continue to fund roads, bridges, and utility upgrades with priority.
- Rebuild roads, add extra paved 8-foot shoulder. Add bicycle events. Add a hotel tax to pay for roads. All cities and restaurants benefit. People want to live in Sonoma County, even if it is a weekend trip. We all drive on the roads and should maintain them with gasoline tax.
- More chip-seal—it is most cost effective and prevents cracks, water infiltration, and potholes.

# Santa Rosa Town Hall Notes Roseland Annexation

## Challenges:

- · Will the money tax base increase?
- With Hearn, is it a conflict of interest between the city and county? Heritage designation vs. 32 new homeless apartments for a Veterans Affairs facility.
- Better stores on Sebastopol Road.
- Fair and equitable tax sharing scheme between city and county since city has been so reluctant to pursue annexation and properly informing citizens of advantages.
- · The costs to pay for services like water, light, and gas are increasing.

- · Add more events that attract hotel guests; add a tax.
- · There is no reason Roseland cannot be a productive contribution to Santa Rosa.

# Santa Rosa Town Hall Notes Tourism, Wineries/VRBOs

## Challenges:

- · Vineyards are a pesticide and water shortage issue.
- · Event centers are not agriculture.
- Tourism is a valuable source of jobs and income. How can we balance this to make a positive impact that is sustainable and keeps money in our county?

- Encourage the resurgence of the apple industry, which uses less water and fewer pesticides.
- Viticulture is not water or pesticide intensive when done properly. Incentivize best practice IPM and water use.

# Santa Rosa Town Hall Notes Other

## Challenges:

- · Help people with disabilities.
- · Clean communities with security.
- · Funding for universal childcare in Sonoma County is needed.
- · Jobs need to provide better wages. Field workers are under-paid.
- We import most of our food, but Sonoma County can produce much more locally.
   Support agricultural development and preservation.
- · More funding for treatment centers in Sonoma County.
- Sustainable groundwater plan,
- Drought mitigation/water conservation.
- · Speech up the quiet zones for the SMART train crossings.
- Water shortage.
- Compost and recycling locally—stop shipping waste out of the county. We need a
  new compost site.

- Terminate contract with Republic to Run landfill. Bring solid waste back to county control and ownership.
- · Workers are paid time overtime after working for 8 hours.
- How to determine legitimate even activity at wineries, especially those with active
  use permits with conditions—proper compliance assurance.
- Use proven techniques to create a resilient agricultural economy that sequesters carbon, reverse climate change, and feeds our citizens without poisoning the land.
- · Vision zero as a goal to reduce fatalities on transportation.
- Parcel tax or sales tax to fund child care.
- All new construction should require rainwater captivating systems for irrigating,
   etc. No new building permits until water issues are well under control.
